The analytical results for this pit represent a combination of bedrock and soil samples. Thus, determination of horizontal and vertical delineation of soil impacts is based on both soil analytical information and field measurements/observations. Based on the analytical and field screening results, horizontal soil impacts delineation is considered complete. Soil impacts are limited to soil observed in the center borehole, and these soil impacts extended from approximately 6.0 ft bgs to the bedrock surface as evidenced by bedrock recovered in the core. In most perimeter boreholes, soil cover is approximately 1.0 ft thick above bedrock. Vertical impacted soil delineation is considered complete because soil impacts were observed to extend to the bedrock surface in the center borehole; weathered bedrock was recovered at approximately 8.5 ft bgs in the center borehole. Investigation of bedrock impacts was conducted within the abilities of the drilling equipment used. As such, horizontal and vertical extent of bedrock impacts remains unresolved.
