## **INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY**

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

In accordance with COGCC Rule 911, this form serves as notification for the abandonment of the Rory 1 wellhead and removal of the associated flowline. The ground and sub-surfaces will be visually inspected for hydrocarbon impacts during abandonment activities. Field observations and photo documentation will be recorded in a field inspection form for submittal to the COGCC.

## **PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN**

### **Proposed Soil Sampling**

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? ( Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples ):

Soil samples will be collected from the surface in cardinal directions of the wellhead, as defined in the Rule 911.a.(4) guidance document (1/4/21), for field screening purposes. Discrete soil samples will be collected for laboratory analysis either in any area of observed hydrocarbon impacts, or adjacent to the cut and capped wellhead from native material and below the flowline riser. GPS data will be collected for all soil sample locations. Soil samples will be submitted for laboratory for analysis of Organic Compounds in Soil, TPH (C6-C36), and Soil Suitability for Reclamation by COGCC approved methods. Refer to the Wellhead and Flowline Location Map. A sample location figure will be provided in the Supplemental Form 27.

### **Proposed Groundwater Sampling**

Will groundwater samples be collected as part of this investigation? ( Number, analyses, and locations of samples ):

If groundwater is encountered during decommissioning and/or abandonment activities, a grab sample will be collected as soon as practical. If contaminated soil is in contact with groundwater or if free product/hydrocarbon sheen are observed, the release will be reported in accordance with Rule 912.b. Groundwater samples will be submitted for laboratory analysis of BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, and 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene by EPA Method 8260.

## **Additional Investigative Actions**

Additional alternative investigative actions described in attached Site Investigation Plan ( summary ):

Assessments will be conducted during the removal of this off-location flowline (estimated to be 490 feet in length) approximately every 250 feet and at the flowline endcaps. Additional assessments will be conducted in the areas where the flowline is in close proximity to sensitive areas, such as High Priority Habitats and FWS wetlands that are observed in each direction. The flowline and adjacent sub-surface will be inspected for any visual and olfactory indicators of potential failure and hydrocarbon impacts. Soils will be field screened below the flowline and if suspected impacts are observed, a soil sample will be collected for an initial assessment and submitted for laboratory analysis of BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-TMB, 1,3,5-TMB, and TPH (C6-C36). If analytical results indicate the presence of organic compound concentrations, the sample will be analyzed for the full Table 915-1 suite. GPS data and photo documentation will be recorded for each inspection/sample location.

On November 8, 2021, one background samples (BKG01 @ 7') was collected from native material topographically up-gradient of the wellhead and submitted for analysis of pH. Analytical results indicated that pH was in compliance with applicable Table 915-1 standard in native material.

On November 8th and December 3, 2021, field screening and confirmation soil sampling was conducted adjacent to the wellhead, below the flowline riser and along the flowline of the Rory 1 wellhead and flowline (figure 1) . Soils were visually inspected and field screened for volatile organic compound (VOC) concentrations using a photoionization detector (PID). Per the approved proposed soil sampling plan, four soil samples were collected at approximately 3 feet, 4 feet, and 7 feet below ground surface (bgs) from undisturbed areas most likely to be impacted by oil and gas operations located adjacent to and below production infrastructure. Soil samples FLR-01, FL-01 and FL-02 and WH-01 were submitted for laboratory analysis of Organic Compounds in Soil and TPH (C6-C36). Soil samples FL-01 and FL-02 were submitted for laboratory analysis of BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-TMB, 1,3,5-TMB, and TPH (C6-C36). Soil samples WH-01, FLR-01, and BKG-01 were also submitted for laboratory analysis of pH, electrical conductivity (EC), sodium adsorption ration (SAR), and boron . Analytical results indicated that organic compounds were in compliance with the applicable Table 915-1 Protection of Groundwater SSLs. and that pH was in exceedance of Table 915-1 standards for the soil sample WH-01 @ 7'. Consequently, one background soil samples, BKG- 01 @ 7' was collected and submitted for laboratory analysis of pH. Analytical results indicated that pH was in compliance with applicable standard in native material. See attachments for tables, figures, lab reports, closure checklists, and photos.
