INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

During emergency response operations, the pipeline was excavated and repaired. On April 12, 2022 samplers dug five (5) boreholes both within and outside the area excavated for emergency repair. Field EC and PID screening was used to identify and collect grab samples from the most impacted depth interval of each borehole. Sample results indicate that all samples are above Table 915-1 Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs) for EC, SAR, arsenic, and boron. Sampling activities conducted on 4/12/22 are reported in Attachments B-F.

Five (5) boreholes are to be dug outside of the previously sampled area to totally delineate the E&P impacted soils. If field conditions indicate that soils are above Table 915-1 MCLs, the boreholes may be dug further away from the release source. Two additional background samples are to be collected. A proposed sample location diagram is include in Attachment G.

The origin of the release (flowline collar) has been repaired. Impacted soils are to be removed via dig and haul to the WM Colorado Springs Landfill.

Impacted soils are to be removed via dig and haul to the WM Colorado Springs Landfill. A vac truck and/or hand tools may be used to excavate soil immediately adjacent to flowlines. Remediation activities are to take place during Q3 of 2022. Citation expects project closure to occur by December 31, 2022.

Citation also carries pollution/waste liability insurance of \$20,000,000, and environmental related liability insurance of \$3,000,000 for all active wells and \$1,000,000 for all plugged and abandoned wells. Citation maintains \$1,135,000 in surety bonds with the COGCC. There is no site-specific financial assurance associated with this remediation project. Citation does not intend to file an insurance claim for this remediation project. This remediation project is very close to completion and is anticipated to be closed in Q3 of 2022.
