A site investigation was conducted pursuant to COGCC Rule 911 at the UPRC T4N-R67W-S23 L01 Tank Battery location.

Four (4) grab confirmation soil samples were collected from the produced water vessel excavation (2), beneath the ground oil tank (1), and at the separator (1). Soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons), organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1, EC, SAR, pH, and boron. One (1) waste characterization sample for COGCC Table 915-1 metals was collected.

All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved COGCC laboratory analysis methods.

A background sample for pH and COGCC Table 915-1 metals was collected. Residual arsenic, and barium at the produced water vault excavation are consistent with background comparison.

A site investigation will be scheduled to delineate impacted media identified at WV-FS-01 @6'. Chevron proposes soil samples will be collected adjacent to WV-FS-01 for analysis of TPH (C6-C36) and organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1.

If groundwater is encountered during the additional assessment, each soil boring will be completed as a monitoring well and the groundwater will be sampled for BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene, 1-methylnaphthalene, and inorganic parameters.

A site investigation will be completed prior to January 1, 2023 to delineate residual soil impacts at the site. Pending protection of a groundwater soil screening levels applicability determination, source excavation activities will be completed to address residual soil impacts exceeding residential soil screening levels.

Chevron proposes soil samples will be collected adjacent to WV-FS-01 for analysis of TPH (C6-C36) and organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1.

REMEDIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Describe how remediation of existing impacts to soil and groundwater is to be accomplished (i.e. summarize remedial action plan). Residual petroleum hydrocarbon impacts will be delineated through an environmental site assessment prior to January 1, 2023. Once delineated, source excavation activities will be started to remove impacts at the site by April 1, 2023. Site assessment data will be summarized and provided in a supplemental 27 to confirm the excavation scope and SAP prior to implementation. NFA will be considered when soil and/or groundwater (if encountered) concentrations are in compliance with COGCC Table 915-1 standards.
