OPERATOR COMMENT

Impacts from organic compounds are not as likely from coal bed methane "CBM" produced water. As such, analysis of some Table 915-1 Organic Compounds in Soils or other contaminants of concern may not be necessary to analyze for closure of CBM produced water Pits. Attached analytical results from the Black Gold 32-33 well demonstrate that the CBM produced water does not contain liquid hydrocarbons and we are requesting a reduction in the 915-1 constituents to match the Soil Suitability for Reclamation list of EC, SAR, pH and boron.
