Denise,

Bob's analysis appears to be correct. The discrepancy is between the original amount invoiced and the late charges shown at the bottom of the invoice attached to your 2/10/2010 email below. I understand that the State will not normally pay late charges. You should discuss that with Angie and/or Wendy to determine if there are any extenuating circumstances in this case that might qualify for late charges. As far as I am aware, we only received two invoices: the original invoice (which I apparently did not turn into Angie for processing), and the invoice that you have, which shows seven months of accumulated late charges.

Mike Leonard's summaries attached to your 2/10/2010 provide the current status of the project in detail. The well is still venting gas to the atmosphere, and it still needs to be P&A'd. The work performed by Eagle Roustabout was to investigate the condition of the well and prepare it for P&A.
