INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

The Schrader #1 wellhead and associated flowline will be assessed per ECOM Rule 911.a. Soil and groundwater (if present) samples will be collected and submitted for laboratory analysis to determine if concentrations and values are in compliance with ECOM Table 915-1. Visual inspection and field screening of soils around the wellhead and associated flowline will be conducted during sampling activities. The Topographic Site Location Map showing the geographic setting of the site is provided.

Following the wellhead cut and cap operations, soil will be sampled from the base of the excavation adjacent to the wellhead, at each sidewall within the excavation and adjacent to the flowline endpoint riser. Soil samples will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis using standard methods appropriate for detecting the target analytes in ECOM Table 915-1. Background samples will be collected at locations of comparable, nearby, non-impacted, native soil. Proposed soil sample locations are provided.

If groundwater is encountered during facility decommissioning activities, a minimum of one grab sample will be collected as soon as practical. Groundwater samples will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis of benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, total xylenes (BTEX), naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, and 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene, using standard methods appropriate for detecting the target analytes in ECOM Table 915-1.
