Dear Mr. Visintainer,

CLX Energy is preparing to submit our State and BLM drilling permits for the Blue Gravel 3-23 Well. This is the well we discussed on your ranch last November and executed the Right-of-Way Agreement. We delayed filing for these permits because we reviewed our geology (which in turn changed our drilling plans – we now intend to drill a 4,300 ft. well, instead of a 6,300 ft. well), and at the time we couldn't find any available rigs. Rigs are still very scarce; however, a shallower drilling depth opens more rig opportunities. Our plan is to be ready to drill within the time frame of your ranch requirements (lambling and hunting season, etc.) in case a rig becomes available.

We hope this meets with your approval, and we would like to renew discussions with Mr. Hoskin with regard to an oil and gas lease on the adjoining 160-acre parcel in the SE/4 of Section 22. I just wanted to update you as to our current plans for this well. Please give Mr. Henderson or me a call at (303) 825-7080 if you have any questions or need additional information.

Dear Mr. Visintainer,

Prior to issuing a drilling permit, the Colorado Oil & Gas Commission requires, among other things that an oil company must give the landowner at least thirty days notice of moving in a drilling rig and advise as to the surface restoration agreements. Please accept this letter as meeting the requirements of the Commission.

CLX has no immediate intentions of moving in a drilling rig in as much as we don't have the permits (state or federal) approved as of this writing. The drilling rig situation is still very tight in the area, and I am guessing we are still three to four months away from being ready to drill at the earliest. The start-up date must also be coordinated with your lease stipulations (hunting, lambing seasons, etc.), the weather, rig availability and the BLM regulations.

With regard to surface restoration, CLX proposes to abide by the reseeding and restoration provisions as listed in your surface access agreement and recited below.

As I said we have no immediate plans to begin drilling; however, CLX intends to comply with all of the regulations, and this letter of notice is one of them. Please give me a call at (303) 825-7080 if you have any questions or need additional information.

- Surface agreement or surface reclamation bond



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**Pursuant to Rule 303 this APD will be withdrawn if complete information is not received by 11-30-01**

Rule 303.g. **Incomplete applications.** Permit applications which are submitted without the necessary attachments, the proper signature or the required information shall be considered incomplete and shall not be approved. The COGCC staff shall notify the applicant in not more than thirty (30) days of application receipt of such inadequacies. The applicant shall then have thirty (30) days from the date which they were contacted to correct and/or provide requested information for that well, otherwise the application shall be considered withdrawn and the fee shall not be refunded
