INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Pursuant to ECMC Rule 911 a site investigation will be conducted pertaining to the CDOT F01-10 wellhead cut and cap and flowline removal. Approximately 126' of flowline was removed.

The wellhead will be cut and capped per ECMC rules. Additionally, soil samples will be field screened at the N-E-S-W sides of the wellhead. Soil samples will be taken along the flowline at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, as well as at the bell holes on either side of a waterway. The Flowline Pre-Abandonment Notice Document number is included under Related Forms.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

Grab confirmation soil samples were collected along the flowline at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, as well as at the bell holes on either side of a waterway, AS APPLICABLE to abandonment type. Soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons) organic compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, and boron. All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved ECMC laboratory analysis methods.

A grab confirmation soil sample will be collected at the wellhead excavation in base of the excavation or the area showing the highest degree of impact during abandonment activities.

Impacted soil will be removed from the release area at the CDOT F 1-10 flowline location by excavation. The impacted soil will be disposed of at an approved landfill as non-hazardous waste in accordance with Rules 905 and 906. Copies of the waste manifests will be available upon request.

REMEDIATION SUMMARY

Describe how remediation of existing impacts to soil and groundwater is to be accomplished (i.e. summarize remedial action plan). Excavation of impacted soil will be undertaken to remove impacts observed at approximately three feet below ground surface at the 'FL02 3Ft' location. The operator proposes to use the impacted 'FL02 3Ft' sample as a waste characterization sample and is requesting to analyze confirmation soil samples collected from the excavation for ECMC Table 915-1 Polycyclic Aromatic Hydrocarbons [PAHs] only based on the laboratory results provided in the attached data package.

Groundwater is estimated to be located at 30 feet below ground surface based on Colorado Division of Water Resources data from a commercial well located within a quarter mile of the release location (Permit No. 222813). Since there is a separation of >20 feet between impacted soil and groundwater the operator proposes to use the residential soil screening levels (RSSLs) for all future remedial activities related to this release.

Should no additional active remediation be required following source removal at the location, a no further action (NFA) determination will be requested within 90 days following laboratory confirmation of the removal of impacted soils with respect to the applicable Table 915-1 screening levels at the site. If groundwater impacts are observed, an NFA will be requested once four consecutive quarters of groundwater sampling have been completed and reported at the location with concentrations of Table 915 constituents below regulatory limits.
