Initial Form 19 was submitted by previous operator, current operator has no knowledge of any response measures other than what is described on Initial Form 19 Doc#, May 12, 2016. Caerus was contacted by the landowner of a leaking component on a wellhead. When the lead lease operator got to the site he saw that cattle knocked down the panels around the wellhead and broke off a 1/4" gauge which began to leak produced water. The lead lease operator installed supports to the panels and stopped the leaking by inserting a plug to the 1/4" connection. There was not enough water to use a vac truck

After initial soil samples, area will be treated with agricultural grade gypsum and, if necessary, straw spread, EC testing will be done on regular basis to monitor gypsum treatments, additional gypsum treatments as necessary. Once EC levels are acceptable, soil samples will be taken for Table 915-1 analysis and area will be seeded, if necessary, with straw stitched to maintain grass seed and prevent erosion.
