INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

A third-party water hauler left a valve partially open resulting in 10 bbls of fluid to be released inside lined containment and 7 bbls to be released outside containment. The spill was contained to the pad surface and has been controlled. Surface impacts have been removed, however, appear to lead underneath adjacent temporary frac tanks. The tanks will be removed, and source removal will continue.

Proposed Soil Sampling

Twenty-seven (27) grab confirmation soil samples have been collected and submitted for laboratory analysis of the amended sap, Arsenic, SAR, and EC as approved by the commission on Form 19 Doc #403475906. Analytical results indicate elevated arsenic levels in 14 of the samples collected. EC and SAR was compliant in all samples.

SOURCE REMOVAL SUMMARY

Describe how source is to be removed.

Approximately 250 cubic yards have been removed and hauled for disposal under waste manifest. Confirmation samples were collected and analyzed for Arsenic, SAR, and EC as approved by the commission on Form 19 Doc #403475906. Analytical results indicated elevated arsenic levels in 14 samples. Additional source removal will occur, and confirmation soil samples will be collected and submitted for Arsenic.

Due to heavy truck traffic on pad, for health and safety reasons, the excavation of impacted soil was split into two parts. The impacts in the north part of the spill footprint have been removed and confirmation samples were collected and submitted for Arsenic, SAR, and EC. Analytical results indicated this section to be in compliance with ECOM Table 915 and has since been backfilled. The impacted soil in the south section of the spill footprint is currently being excavated and confirmation samples were collected and submitted for Arsenic. Analytical results indicate elevated levels of Arsenic in all 14 samples collected. As stated above, additional source removal will occur and additional confirmation samples will be collected and submitted for Arsenic.
