OPERATOR COMMENT

The SMITH ENERGY CORP - 70385 RUNNING-CREEK STATE-66S64W 16SE14N (Location #322201) remote Tank Battery and related RUNNING CREEK STATE #11 (OWP) oil and gas well (API #05-039-06583) and off-location flowline are in the ECMC Orphaned Well Program (OWP). Civitas Resources/Extraction Oil & Gas LLC will plug and abandon the Running Creek State #11 (OWP) well as part of a public project at a future date. The OWP oversaw decommissioning of the tank battery and off-location flowline abandonment in place as requested by the surface landowner. Groundwater was not encountered in the excavations and is expected to lie at depths greater than 100 ft below ground surface (bgs). This supplemental Form 27 presents the site investigation results for soil samples collected during the tank battery decommissioning. A spill/release (#484700) was discovered at the produced water vault (PWV) with pH and SAR levels above the Table 915-1 soil suitability for reclamation parameter levels at 6 ft bgs. A spill/release was also encountered at the separator with total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) reported at 1813 ppm and several polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAH) reported above Table 915-1 soil screening levels (SSL) in a soil sample collected at 2 ft bgs. Additional site investigation and remediation will proceed under Remediation Project #26797.
