INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Sampling was conducted on 2/29/2024. Soil samples were taken at SP2 (3' and 4' bgs), and BG-01 (3' and 4' bgs). Background samples collected at BG-01 indicate that Arsenic Clean-Up Levels are 8.25mg/kg (1.25xBG (6.6 mg/kg) = 8.25 mg/kg). All background samples are within ECMC Table 915-1 for pH standards. SP5 (background) soil sample collected on 10/26/2023 is above Table 915-1 pH standards. Following discussion with the landowner, a reclamation plan will be submitted addressing the pH in the next Form 27 supplemental (note: location is in cropland).
