Stakeholder Best Management Practices (BMP's):

Planned Community Consultation Throughout Permitting:

- We will continue proactively engage with owners and tenants nearest to the proposed facility location and focus on stakeholders within 2,000 feet. The project area is not linguistically isolated; however, we will include an offer for interpretation services.
- We offer a variety of engagement opportunities such as community meetings, door-to-door, small group meetings, phone calls, and emails upon request.
- In addition to the outreach that has already been conducted, we will provide owners and tenants within 2,000 feet with the following information via mailed notices and/or community meetings:
 - Proposed location description and map, including legal description



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- The number and orientation of wells, types of equipment, and infrastructure related to anticipated operations
- A description, proposed timeline, and expected duration
- The proposed haul routes and traffic volume
- A description of each stage of operation along with a description of our BMPs to mitigate potential impacts including noise, light, odor, dust, traffic, and visual
