This is a resubmission of Form 403782695 that includes the analytical attachments.

From from 403782695:

Summit Midstream plans to drill this site for delineation purposes in Summer 2024. Summit plans to advance five (northeast, southeast, southwest, northwest, and center) borings in and around the excavation area.

A depth to water discussion is included as an attachment to this form. Based on information provided, Summit asserts that there is no clear path to groundwater on this Site and the Residential Soil Screening Levels should be used.

Lateral delineation borings will be sampled at the approximate depths of impacts previously observed. The vertical delineation boring will be sampled at the approximate depths of impacts and below.

Based on previous results, summit requests the reduced analyte suite of EC, SAR, pH, and Arsenic. Please see the attached map for the approximate boring locations. The exact location of these borings may have to be adjusted in the field due to local conditions.

In addition, Summit plans to advance an additional boring in a native non-disturbed area and collect additional background sample(s). Summit requests approval of the delineation and background sampling plan above.

	ECMC agrees to the reduced analyte suite of EC, SAR, pH, and Arsenic only.
	ECMC approves of the proposed soil boring/monitoring well locations. Additionally, depending on the results of the current site investigation plan, Operator may be required to install additional soil borings/monitoring wells to fully delineate soil impacts.
	Operator will submit a minimum of one soil sample for the proposed laboratory analysis from each soil boring advanced during monitoring well installation.
	Operator shall fully populate the implementation schedule in accordance with Rule 913.d on the subsequent Supplemental Form 27.
	If a spill/release of produced fluids or E&P waste causes an impact to soil, the operator should perform sampling and analysis to fully delineate the lateral and vertical extent of those impacts.
	Arsenic concentrations in confirmation soil samples exceed the Table 915-1 Residential Soil Screening Level Concentrations and are greater than 1.25 times the concentration in the background sample.
