RECLAMATION PLANNING

The well was plugged and abandoned on 04/07/2023 and a subsequent Form 6 was approved. This included the GPS coordinates of the as-drilled location. During final reclamation the cellar was removed and backfilled. All debris, and surface equipment was removed. There were no flowlines on this location that needed to be abandoned and reclaimed. The well had no hydrocarbon shows or flows during the drilling, testing or encountered during plugging and abandoning. No production facilities were ever installed on this location. The access road was closed, graded and recontoured. The topsoil was taken from the stockpile and redistributed evenly across the area and the surface was reconstructed to original contours. Then the location was seeded using a Colorado State Land Board (surface owner) approved seed mix with the assistance of the local NRCS office. The seed mix was broadcast-seeded at twice the application rate shown and covered 0.25 to 0.5 inches deep. No noxious weeds were found in the disturbed areas prior to reclamation. An intensive weed monitoring control program is being implemented along with the stormwater management plan.

May 2024 remediation operations includes exposing P&A's wellhead and cuttings trench. Impacted soils from both locations were identified and readied for commercial disposal. Then after the site is cleared of impacted soils it will be closed, graded and recontoured. Then the location will be reseeded in newly disturbed areas.
