INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Pursuant to CECMC Rule 911 a site investigation was conducted pertaining to the CHAMPLIN 78 AMOCO C wellhead cut and cap. The wellhead was cut and capped per Form 6 Doc #403584204. Confirmation soil sampling results from the former wellhead and tank battery locations are included as an attachment to this Form. Additional conformation samples will be collected after the on-location flowline is removed, which is scheduled for July 8, 2024 (Form 42 Doc#403754523). Results of which will be submitted in a supplemental Form 27.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Three (3) grab soil samples were collected at the former wellhead and tank battery locations. Soil samples were analyzed by a NELAP accredited laboratory for the full Table 915- analyses. Based on the laboratory analytical data from the May 7, 2024 confirmation soil sampling event, all constituents of concern from the Series 900 Rules Table 915-1 are below the regulatory standards or within background concentrations. The "TANK02" sample has a slightly elevated pH that appears to be de minimis and may not be associated with E&P activities. Based on soil samples collected to date the Operator is requesting a reduced analytical suite to include all Table 915-1 organic compounds, Boron, EC, SAR, and pH. The arsenic concentrations from all three soil sample locations were above the Table 915-1 standard which are attributable to background levels.

The seed mix will be approved by the surface owner.
