A site investigation was conducted pursuant to ECMC Rule 911 at the RAGAN ROACH T5N-R67W-S1 L01 Facility and Tank Battery location.

**PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN****Proposed Soil Sampling**

Grab confirmation soil samples were collected from the produced water vessel(s) excavation, beneath the ground oil tank(s), at the risers for the flowline (s) and dumphine(s) of any separator(s). In addition, the on-site dump lines located between the separator and tank battery were removed by pulling from either end. Soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for the full extent of Table 915-1, including but not limited to: TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons) organic compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, metals, and boron. All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved ECMC laboratory analysis methods.

If groundwater is encountered during the site investigation a grab groundwater will be collected and analyzed for all organic and inorganic compounds per ECMC Table 915-1; this sample analysis includes, but is not limited to BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene (TMB), and 1,3,5-TMB by EPA Method 8260, chloride and sulfate anions by EPA Method 300.0, and total dissolved solids (TDS) by Method SM 2540C.

Visual inspection at the tank battery area occurred during abandonment activities. Field personnel field screened all disturbed areas using visual and olfactory senses. Additionally, discrete soil samples were collected from the base of the excavation and excavation sidewall in areas most likely to be impacted and exhibiting the highest field screened VOC concentration. The ECMC Tank Battery and Produced Water Vessel Closure Checklists were utilized and filled out during the abandonment process. A photolog is attached to this form.

Four background soil samples were collected near the tank battery and analyzed for metals in soil per ECMC Table 915-1, pH, SAR, EC, and boron. Background soil samples were collected from depths ranging between 0.5 to 6 feet below ground surface (ft bgs). The maximum background concentrations for pH, SAR, and EC were observed to be 8.64, 0.581, and 0.331, respectively. The maximum background concentrations with a 1.25x multiplier applied for arsenic, barium, and lead were calculated to be 5.26, 131, and 9.06, respectively.

Soil analytical results for samples collected during tank battery decommissioning activities indicated that organic compound concentrations were in exceedance of the applicable ECMC regulatory standards in soil samples AST01@0-6" and AST02@0-6". The 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene, Naphthalene, TPH, 1-methylnaphthalene, and 2-methylnaphthalene exceedances observed at sample locations AST01@0-6" and AST02@0-6" will be removed through a remedial excavation.

Basis for change in implementation schedule:

The implementation schedule has been changed due to the decommissioning of the Roach N-65N67W 14NWSE tank battery and necessity for remedial excavation activities adjacent to the tank battery. The proposed remedial excavation will be completed following the approval of this form, landowner negotiations, and crew availability.

## OPERATOR COMMENT

This Form 27 is being submitted to include the decommissioning results and historic reportable releases discovered at the former Roach N-65N67W 14NWSE Tank Battery location.

Soil analytical results for samples collected during tank battery decommissioning activities indicated that organic compound concentrations were in exceedance of the applicable ECMC regulatory standards in soil samples AST01@0-6" and AST02@0-6". The 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene, Naphthalene, TPH, 1-methylnaphthalene, and 2-methylnaphthalene exceedances observed at sample locations AST01@0-6" and AST02@0-6" will be removed through a remedial excavation.

Based on the ECMC Table 915-1 exceedances identified during decommissioning, Noble proposes to limit future soil sampling to BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-TMB, 1,3,5-TMB, TPH, benzo(a)anthracene, chrysene, fluorene, indeno(1,2,3)pyrene, pyrene, 1-M, 2-M, pH, arsenic, barium, and lead. If more impacted material is observed during excavation activities, a sample will be collected and submitted for laboratory analysis of the Full Table 915-1 Suite. If additional analytes are found to be in exceedance of ECMC standards, those analytes will be added to the contaminate of concern list. The results of the remedial excavation will be submitted on a subsequent Form 27.

Quarterly reporting will be conducted until closure criteria are achieved for the remediation project. The results of the supplemental site investigation will be submitted on a subsequent Form 27.
