Grab confirmation soil samples were collected from the produced water vessel(s) excavation, beneath the ground oil tank(s), and at the separator(s). Soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons) organic compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, and boron. All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved ECMC laboratory analysis methods.

Five background soil samples were collected from an area not impacted by oil and gas development and at similar depths (2') and lithologies as confirmation soil samples collected at the location and analyzed for Table 915-1 metals and soil suitability for reclamation (SSR) constituents. Background soil sample analytical results were reported with elevated levels of arsenic, barium, pH, and SAR.

Elevated inorganics and metals were observed in multiple locations at the former OCOMA T4N-R64W-S17 L01 Tank Battery. Soil will be resampled and analyzed for Table 915-1 metals and soil suitability for reclamation (SSR) at all confirmation sample locations at the same depth where the initial elevated concentrations were observed. Noble will request an NFA be granted if the reanalyzed samples comply with the Table 915-1 concentration standard.

Five additional background samples will be collected from an area not impacted by oil and gas development at similar depths (3' and 4') and lithologies as confirmation samples collected at the location and analyzed for ECOMC Table 915-1 metals and soil suitability for reclamation standards (SSR) (pH, EC, SAR, and Boron). The samples will be used to characterize native soil and potentially attribute elevated metals and inorganics concentrations to native soil conditions.

Alternatively, if the sample results exceed the Table 915-1 standards and cannot be attributed to native soil conditions via background soil characterization a minimum of five additional samples will be collected to delineate the magnitude and extent of elevated constituents. Following completion of the delineation, Noble will submit a detailed reclamation plan that includes, but is not limited to, soil analysis from adjacent undisturbed lands, revegetation techniques, site stabilization, and details of seeded species and will request NFA designation be granted under Rule 915.b: Request to leave elevated inorganics in situ.
