INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Pursuant to ECMC Rule 911 a site investigation was conducted pertaining to the SLW Green State BB18-09 wellhead cut and cap and will be conducted for flowline removal. The wellhead was cut and capped per ECMC rules. Additionally, soil samples were field screened at the N-E-S-W sides of the wellhead. Wellhead decommissioning activities took place on 09/16/2024 and were summarized in Supplemental Form 27 #404029157. With full removal of previously ABIP SLW Green State BB18-10 (05-123-19258). Approximately 2086' of flowline will be removed. The ECMC will be updated in a supplemental Form 27 if a portion of the flowline is abandoned-in-place due to field constraints. Soil samples will be taken along the flowline at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, at the bell holes on either side of a waterway, as well as every 250'. Flowline decommissioning is being conducted by Fremont Environmental Inc. and will be summarized in a Supplemental Form 27.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

A grab soil sample was collected at the base of the wellhead excavation. Additionally, soil samples were field screened at the N-E-S-W sides of the wellhead. Soil samples will be taken along the flowline at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, at the bell holes on either side of a waterway, as well as every 250'. Soil samples were and will be analyzed by a certified laboratory for the full extent of Table 915-1, including but not limited to: TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons) organic compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, metals, and boron. Background soil samples will be analyzed by a certified laboratory for analysis of metals per ECMC Table 915-1 and soil suitability parameters including pH, EC, SAR, and boron. All sample analysis is performed by a certified laboratory using approved ECMC laboratory analysis methods.

Proposed Groundwater Sampling

Will groundwater samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, analyses, and locations of samples):

If groundwater is encountered, a grab groundwater sample will be collected and analyzed for all organic and inorganic compounds per ECMC Table 915-1; this sample analysis includes, but is not limited to BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene (TMB), and 1,3,5-TMB, chloride and sulfate anions and total dissolved solids (TDS).

Additional Investigative Actions

Additional alternative investigative actions described in attached Site Investigation Plan (summary):

Visual inspection of the wellhead area occurred during abandonment activities and will occur during flowline decommissioning. Field personnel screened all disturbed areas using visual and olfactory senses to determine if laboratory confirmation sampling was required. The ECMC Wellhead Closure Checklist was utilized and filled out during the abandonment process and the Flowline Closure Checklist will be filled out during decommissioning.

Noble plans to conduct background soil sampling from at least three boring locations at similar depths and soil horizons as confirmation soil samples, in areas away from oil and gas infrastructure to further investigate residual inorganic concentrations in soil at the site.

Flowline decommissioning activities will be completed by another consultant and will be summarized in a subsequent Supplemental Form 27 submittal.

Pursuant to Rule 913.e, quarterly reporting will continue for the location until data indicates no further action is warranted.
