INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Decommissioning activities were completed at the Canepa 6-21, 22, 24, 25 production facility on November 4, 2024. Visual inspection and field screening of soils at one separator, one meter house, two produced water vessels (PWV), two emission control devices (ECD), and two aboveground storage tanks (AST) were conducted following removal activities and soil samples (SEP-B01@3", SEP-B02@4", AST-B01@3", AST-B03@3", PW-B01@6", PW-N01@5", PW-B02@6", PW-S02@5") were submitted for laboratory analysis of Table 915-1 Contaminants of Concern to determine if a release occurred. Laboratory analytical results indicated that the benzo(a)anthracene and pH concentrations in soil sample AST-B01@3" and the naphthalene, 1-methylnaphthalene, and 2-methylnaphthalene concentrations in soil sample PW-B02@5" exceeded the applicable ECMC Table 915-1 standards and/or background limits. As such, a Form 19-Initial/Supplemental Spill/Release Report (ECMC Document #404030857) was submitted on December 12, 2024, and the ECMC issued Spill Release Point ID #489226. Final analytical results for the remaining soil samples were within ECMC Table 915-1 standards and/or within site-specific background limits. A topographic Site Location Map showing the geographic setting of the site location is provided as Figure 1. Soil sample location and field screening data is presented in Table 1. The soil sample and field screening locations are illustrated on Figure 2. The secured laboratory analytical reports are attached. The field notes and a photographic log are provided as Attachment A.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

On January 9, 2025 through February 5, 2025, excavation activities were conducted to address the soil impacts at the former produced water vault and AST, and 5 confirmation soil samples were collected from the base and/or sidewalls of the final excavation extents, at depths ranging from approximately 2' - 6' below ground surface (bgs). The confirmation soil samples were submitted for laboratory analysis of ECMC Table 915-1 Contaminants of Concern using ECMC-approved methods. Final analytical results indicated that impacted soils were removed, and constituent concentrations in the soil samples collected from the final excavation extents were in compliance with ECMC Table 915-1 standards and/or within background limits. Soil analytical results are summarized in Tables 2 through 5. The excavation confirmation sample locations are illustrated on Figure 3.

Additional Investigative Actions

Additional alternative investigative actions described in attached Site Investigation Plan (summary):

On November 4, 2024, visual inspections and field screening of soils was conducted at six sidewalls of the PWV excavations, two ECDs, one meter house, and beneath two former ASTs. Based on the inspection and screening results, hydrocarbon-impacted soils were not observed at the soil screening locations. As a result, no soil samples were submitted for laboratory analysis from these areas in accordance with the ECMC Operator Guidance for Oil & Gas Facility Closure document.

Background soil samples AST-BG01@3" - AST-BG03@3" were collected from non-impacted native material (silty loam) nearby the tank battery. Background soil samples from the Canepa 6-15 wellhead (located approximately 2000' SE) have been included (collected from similar depths (3' and 6' bgs), soil type (silty loam), and from the same crop field, as approved in the previous Form 27-Supplemental Document #404007331. The background soil samples were submitted for laboratory analysis of the Soil Suitability for Reclamation Parameters and ECMC Table 915-1 Metals using standard methods appropriate for detecting target analytes in ECMC Table 915-1. Analytical results for the background soil samples are presented in Tables 3 and 5. The background locations are illustrated on Figures 3 through 5.

Between January 9, 2025 through February 5, 2025, approximately 90 cubic yards of impacted soil was excavated and transported to the Front Range Landfill located in Erie, Colorado for disposal. The excavation area will be backfilled and contoured to match pre-existing conditions.

Laboratory analytical results indicated that constituent concentrations in the confirmation soil samples collected from the final excavation extents were in compliance with the applicable ECMC Table 915-1 standards and/or within background limits. Groundwater was not encountered during decommissioning or excavation activities. Based on the analytical and soil screening data presented herein, assessment is complete at this site and no further activities are required. As such, Kerr-McGee is requesting a No Further Action (NFA) determination for this location.
