This Form 27S is being submitted to meet the quarterly reporting; no work as conducted in the last quarter. Sampling at the Peck TB was conducted on 10/25/2023, 2/29/2024, and 10/8/2024. Soil samples were collected at 1' and 4' bgs on 10/8/2024 at SP5, SP6, SP 7, SP8, SP9 and SP10. Analytical results are above Table 915-1 at SP7 (8.43 pH). Background soil samples collected on 2/29/2024 indicate that local cleanup standards for pH is 8.48. Delineation samples will collected at SP1, SP3, and SP4.
