INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Sampling at the Peck TB was conducted on 10/25/2023, 2/29/2024, and 10/8/2024. Soil samples were collected at 1' and 4' bgs on 10/8/2024 at SP5, SP6, SP 7, SP8, SP9 and SP10. Analytical results are above Table 915-1 at SP7 (8.43 pH).

Samples were collected on 5/15/2025 to delineate pH. SP-13 pH exceeded Table 915-1 (8.32 @ 4' and 8.43 @ 5'); background soil samples collected on 2/29/2024 indicate that local cleanup standards for pH is 8.48.

Operator respectfully requests a No Further Action. A reclamation plan is attached to address the elevated pH levels at SP1, SP3, and SP4. and SP7.
