INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

A spill was discovered at the Lorencito 13-15 pit, Location ID:308536, Lat: 37.07904433, Long: -104.7715894 on 3/17/25 and reported to ENR on 3/18/2025 by an ECMC inspector via INSP#713601987. A hole was discovered in a lined pit, in which water was actively seeping through. After inspection by ENR, no water was determined to have left the pit. Spill volume is unknown at this time, however, the well is no longer producing to the pit and water will be drained to begin the process of investigation. No state waters were affected by the spill. (Pit liner has since been removed and soil samples will be collected)

Four grab samples will be collected. One sample at the area of highest impact will be analyzed for full 915-1 analytes. Two other samples at opposite sides of the pit will be collected and analyzed for 915-1 metals and soil suitability for reclamation. A native sample will also be collected and analyzed for 915-1 metals.
