INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Pursuant to ECMC Rule 911 a site investigation was conducted pertaining to the HSR-HOFFMAN #3-24 wellhead cut and cap and flowline removal. The wellhead was cut and capped per ECMC rules. Approximately 1946' of flowline was removed. The associated F44# is 403705275. Four (4) soil samples were collected at the wellhead excavation (1), flowline terminus at the wellhead (1), and at the bell holes on either side of a waterway (2). One (1) soil sample was collected at the flowline terminus at the separator during the facility decommissioning assessment and was reported under Rem. # 27982 (Form 27 Document Number 403668272). The wellhead soil sample was analyzed by a certified laboratory for organic and SSR compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1. The flowline soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for organic, metals, and SSR compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1.

A total of 12 delineation samples were collected in September 2024 associated with the HSR-HOFFMAN #3-24 flowline. Samples were analyzed for pH and arsenic compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1. All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved ECMC laboratory analysis methods.
