## **INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY**

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Pursuant to COGCC Rule 911 a site investigation will be conducted pertaining to the PATRIOT B16-24 wellhead cut and cap and flowline removal. Approximately 620' of flowline will be removed. The wellhead was cut and capped per COGCC rules. Additionally, soil samples will be collected at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, as well as at the bell holes on either side of a waterway, AS APPLICABLE to abandonment type. The Flowline Pre-Abandonment Notice Document number is included under Related Forms.

## **PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN**

### **Proposed Soil Sampling**

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? ( Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples ):

Grab confirmation soil samples were collected along the flowline at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, as well as at the bell holes on either side of a waterway, AS APPLICABLE to abandonment type. Soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons) organic compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, and boron. All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved ECMC laboratory analysis methods. A grab confirmation soil sample will be collected at the wellhead excavation in base of the excavation or the area showing the highest degree of impact during abandonment activities.

Field personnel field screened all disturbed areas using visual and olfactory senses to determine if laboratory confirmation sampling was required. Thirty background soil samples were collected from an area not impacted by oil and gas development and at similar depths (1', 2', 3', and 4') and lithologies as confirmation soil samples collected at the location and analyzed for Table 915 metals and inorganic. Background soil sample analytical results were reported with elevated levels of arsenic, barium, cadmium, lead, selenium and pH.

Impacted soil were removed from the release area at the Patriot B16-24 location by excavation. The impacted soil was disposed of at an approved landfill as non-hazardous waste in accordance with Rules 905 and 906. Copies of the waste manifests will be available upon request. Additional excavation is needed.

**REMEDIATION SUMMARY**

Describe how remediation of existing impacts to soil and groundwater is to be accomplished (i.e. summarize remedial action plan). The impacts observed at the FL01 2 Ft sample location were excavated and confirmation soil samples were collected and analyzed for the full Table 915-1 suite. Groundwater was not encountered during the excavation of impacted soil. Since the total volume of soil was below Rule 912.a.(5) reporting thresholds, a no further action (NFA) determination was requested and granted on Form 19I/S Doc. # 403756228. Additional soil characterization was requested by the ECMC to delineate elevated concentrations of arsenic and selenium encountered in soil samples collected within the Patriot B 16-24 wellhead excavation.

PAH soil impacts were encountered at the S Wall 1FT (2) sample location during soil characterization resampling of soil locations previously observed with elevated concentrations of arsenic and selenium at the Patriot B 16-24 wellhead excavation. Additional background characterization samples justified elevated metals concentrations in all samples but S Wall 1FT (2) sample location. The proposed excavation extent is displayed on Figure 2 of the attached.

The Operator proposes additional excavation to remove impacts at the S Wall 1FT (2) sample location. The source will be excavated and confirmation soil samples will be collected and analyzed for the full Table 915-1 suite of analytes. If groundwater is encountered during the excavation of impacted soil, a groundwater sample will be collected for Table 915-1 organic and inorganic constituents in groundwater (Benzene, Toluene, Ethylbenzene, Total Xylenes (BTEX), naphthalene, 1,2,4-Trimethylbenzene, 1,3,5-Trimethylbenzene, Chloride ion, Sulfate ion and Total Dissolved Solids (TDS). Should no additional active remediation be required following source removal at the location, a no further action (NFA) determination will be requested within 90 days following laboratory confirmation of the removal of impacted soils with respect to the applicable Table 915-1 screening levels at the site.
