MEMORANDUM

TO: Ed DiMatteo, Colorado Oil & Gas Commission

FROM: George D. VanSlyke, Colorado Division of Water Resources *GV*

SUBJECT: Water Injection Well, Blevins A-2, SE/SE Section 3, T9N, R78W, Jackson County, Colorado, Canadian River Field.

This well is to be used as an injection well into the Dakota Formation in the interval between 1,704 feet and 1724 feet. The well spuds in the Mancos/Niobrara Formations and is primary grouted to a depth of 461 feet. The Mancos/Niobrara extends to a depth of approximately 1700 feet. A search of our records indicates that there is only one registered water well within two miles of the proposed injection site. That well is 100 feet in depth and produces water for domestic and stock use. Although there are some units that are potential aquifers in the area such as the Frontier Sandstone at approximately 1000 feet. However, this aquifer is not utilized in this area and is contained behind the secondary cement which begins at a depth of 820 feet.

Based on this, it appears that there is no potential for injury to fresh water sources in the area. I have included a map of the area and a listing of well from our well records. If you have any additional questions, please give me a call.
