Chevron is requesting closure of REM 29884 and approval to begin backfilling this excavation.

Approximately 3700 cubic yards of impacted soil were removed during Site remediation. It is anticipated that approximately 3700 cubic yards of imported clean fill soil from Shallenberger Energy Inc. (formerly Urie) Pit will be used to backfill and reclaim location.
