#### INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

On November 2, 2021 at approximately 1330 hours produced fluids were seen surfacing around a produced water riser at the State Pronghorn CPF 41-32. The line was immediately shut-in and evacuated.

#### PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

##### Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? ( Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples ):

Site assessment soil samples will be collected from within the investigation area to achieve vertical delineation. Historic soil sample locations ([PW-CS-01 @ 8'], [PW-CS-08 @ 8.5'], [PW-CS-06 @ 3'], and [PW-CS-09 @ 8.5']) represent horizontal points of compliance north, east, south, and west of the documented pH exceedance. Soil samples will be collected at 1' greater below ground surface (bgs) than the previous soil samples to achieve vertical delineation adjacent to previous sample location (PW-CS-FS-03 @ 10'). See the Proposed Sample Map attached to this form for approximate sample locations. All soil samples will be analyzed for full ECMC Table 915-1 analytes and will be compared to GWSSLs. Upon landowner access and approval, at least four (4) additional background soil samples will be collected from homogenous soil horizons and/or corresponding excavation sample depths from nearby offsite and undisturbed locations.

##### Proposed Groundwater Sampling

Will groundwater samples be collected as part of this investigation? ( Number, analyses, and locations of samples ):

The nearest water well (Permit # 227566) with a recorded static water level is located approximately 4,000 feet north of the State Pronghorn 41-32 Pad. The recorded static water level of this well is 250 feet. However, Bonanza proposes to set one temporary monitoring well during delineation activities. The temporary monitoring well will be installed to a maximum depth of drilling refusal or 25 feet bgs, whichever is encountered first to determine regulatory screening levels. If groundwater is encountered a sample will be collected from the temporary monitoring well and analyzed for full ECMC Table 915-1 groundwater analytes.
