INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Pursuant to ECMC Rule 911 a site investigation was conducted pertaining to the TODD 20-02 wellhead cut and cap and flowline removal. Approximately 1058' of flowline was removed. The wellhead was cut and capped per ECMC rules. Additionally, soil samples were field screened at the N-E-S-W sides of the wellhead. Soil samples were also taken along the flowline any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, as well as at the bell holes on either side of a waterway.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

A grab soil sample was collected at the base of the excavation or the area showing the highest degree of impact during field screening activities at the wellhead excavation. Additionally, soil samples were field screened at the N-E-S-W sides of the wellhead. Soil samples were taken along the flowline at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, as well as at the bell holes on either side of a waterway. Soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for the full extent of Table 915-1, including but not limited to: TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons) organic compounds in soil per ECMC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, metals, and boron. All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved ECMC laboratory analysis methods.

The implementation schedule has been changed due to the decommissioning of the Todd 20-02 wellhead/flowline and necessity for supplemental site investigation activities adjacent to the wellhead/flowline. The proposed site investigation will be completed following the approval of this form.

OPERATOR COMMENT

This Form 27 is being submitted to include the decommissioning results at the former Todd 20-02 wellhead/flowline location. The WH sampling was conducted by Entrada Consulting in May 2024 and identified no organic exceedances. A secured analytical data report is attached and data summarized in the attached Entrada data package. In August 2024, Tasman conducted sampling activities along the flowline. Upon receipt of a secured laboratory report, analytical findings will be summarized and provided.

A supplemental site investigation (SSI) will be completed to collect additional background samples to determine if elevated levels of pH and arsenic are attributed to native soil conditions at the site. Proposed background sample locations are included in the attached Site Map. Background soil samples will be analyzed by a certified laboratory for analysis of metals per ECMC Table 915-1 and soil suitability parameters including pH, EC, SAR, and boron. The SSI will be completed in accordance with the proposed implementation schedule, and the results of the SSI will be submitted on a subsequent Form 27.

Background samples have not been collected yet due to frozen ground conditions. Background samples are tentatively planned for summer 2025 and will follow previously submitted proposed locations.

The confirmation soil samples collected during wellhead cut and cap activities were determined to be outside of the required temperature preservation range when delivered to the laboratory. Re-sampling will be conducted.

Quarterly reporting will be conducted until closure criteria are achieved for the remediation project. The results of the supplemental site investigation will be submitted on a subsequent Form 27.

In response to ECMC returning to draft Form 27 Document Number 404010004 on 1/27/2025, Operator is submitting a replacement Form 27. Based on currently available data, this project is not affected by data integrity irregularities and is not associated with Operator's data integrity review process and its Rule 525.e. Voluntary Disclosure. As part of its data integrity review process, Operator requested the lab protect the laboratory analytical reports from subsequent unauthorized modification by anyone outside the lab, which resulted in the lab reissuing the original report with additional protections (Reissued Report). The Reissued Report was received directly from the lab on 2/13/2025 which includes a watermark confirming both the laboratory representative who reissued the report and the date and time of the reissuance. The metadata associated with these Reissued Report also includes the lab representative's name, the date and time the laboratory reissued the report, and an explanation for the report reissuance. The Reissued Report is attached to this submission.

Voluntary Disclosure, Operator will update and/or amend the statements in this submission and provide any new or revised data or other information.
