Hi Danielle,
 TEP is planning to perform a casing repair on the subject well.

Under ECMC Rule 312, operators are required to consult with CPW when non-routine maintenance operations are planned, which includes well repairs and plugging operation. We have included the identified HPHs associated with the location and are planning to begin operations upon approval by ECMC.

As a part of this process, we are required to attach any agreed upon BMPs and correspondence between CPW and the operator documenting consultation. To ensure proper well operations, TEP has proposed the Best Management Practices listed below for implementation during planned activities to minimize potential impacts to wildlife. If additional BMPs are necessary, please let us know.
