Hi Anita,

Thank you for consulting with CPW regarding the conversion of the Union Pacific 112x21 well (Location ID 315568) from production to injection. This location is within CPW High Priority Habitats (Aquatic Native Species Conservation Waters and Pronghorn Winter Concentration). CPW staff have field-verified that the adjacent drainage, known as Nate Spring Draw, does not have an Ordinary High Water Mark.

CPW appreciates Scout Energy committing to the following Best Management Practices to protect downstream native fisheries and wintering pronghorn:

- Work will only occur in daylight hours.
- Vehicle traffic will be reduced by carpooling or other measures, adhering to speed limits to reduce risk of vehicle/wildlife collision.
- Any wildlife issues will be promptly reported to CPW.
- Construct lined berms or other lined containment devices pursuant to Rule 603.o around any new crude oil, condensate, and produced water storage Tanks that are installed after January 15, 2021.
- Inspect the Oil and Location on a daily basis, unless the approved Form 2A provides for different inspection frequency or alternative method of compliance.
- Maintain adequate Spill response equipment at the Oil and Gas Location during drilling and completion operations.
