Dear Mr. Smith:

Yours of the 24th of April received and read and I have the following comments.

By now I am sure the failure to permit under our turnkey with RDG has been satisfied. The Form 5 on the 15-5 Running Creek was mailed to you on May 3, 1984. As to the other problems, I have the following to offer.

1. In regard to the #10 Lauridson, SW/NW 29-1S-67W, we turned over operations to Western Oil & Gas on November 23, 1983. Our letter of April 23, 1984 by Jim McGinnis to the Commission states this. As of November 23, 1983 this well had not been drilled.
2. State 16-11, SW/SE, 16-3S-62W - Completion Report and logs were mailed to you on May 4, 1984.
3. State 16-13, SW/SW, 16-6S-63W - We ran casing and turned the well over to Sam Gary Producing. Our Form 5 and logs were mailed to you on May 4, 1984. I suppose Gary has filed the other necessary reports.
4. DTH Venture 14-12, SW/SW, 14-5S-64W was plugged and abandoned. Form 5, Form 4, cement verification and logs were mailed to you on May 4, 1984.
5. Regarding the late production reports - Prior to October of 1983, gas production reports on the Cavanaugh and Ginther did not go out from Northern Natural Gas (the purchaser) until the 25th two months following production. Example: June '83 production was mailed out on August 25, 1983. (see attached) Granted, you should have received the reports before October 5, 1983, however, there was at that time a two month delay in receiving gas production reports from Northern Natural Gas. This problem has somewhat improved. NNG now mails out their reports on the 25th following the month of production, therefore, the Ginther and Cavanaugh production reports will always be a few days late.

Regarding the August State 16-10 report which you received on October 5, 1983 - this report was not several months past due as you stated but rather 10 days late.


